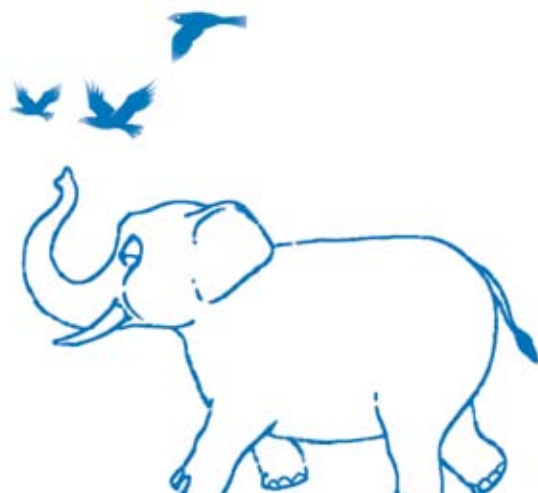
THE AMAZING ADVENTURES OF EQUIANO
